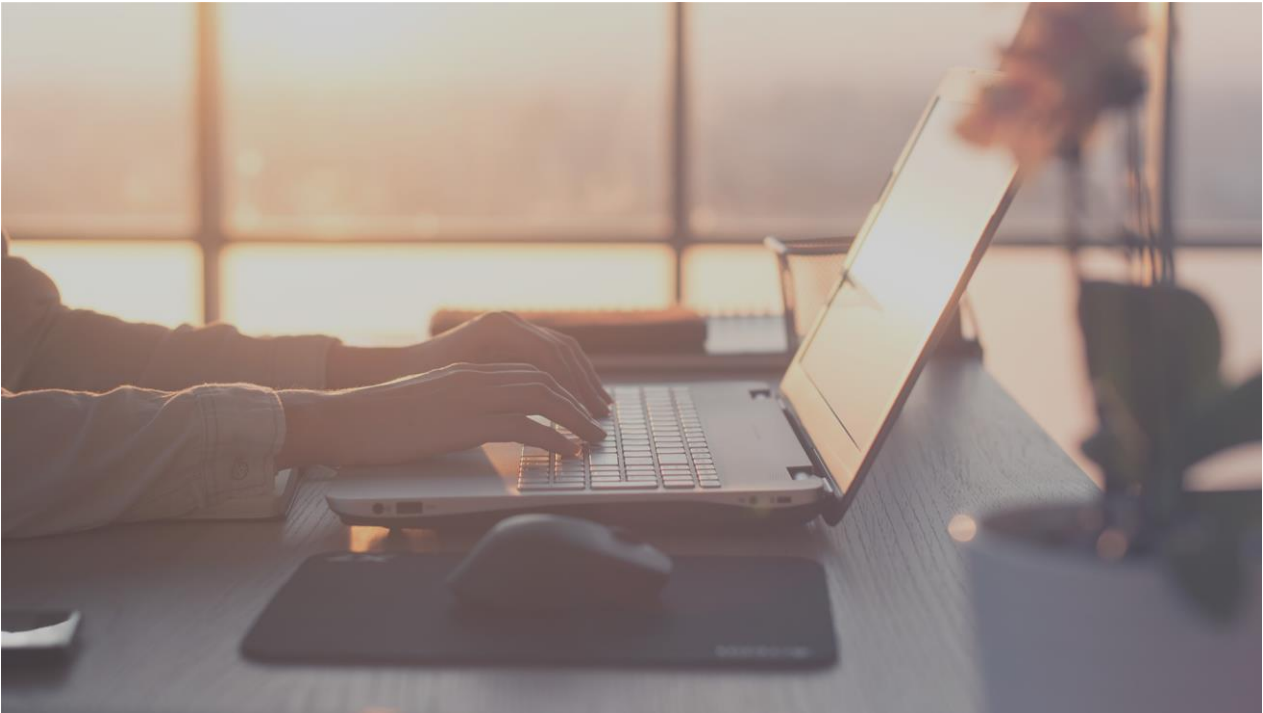

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COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a **virtual course for health professionals in rheumatology (HPR)** on the **basic management of common rheumatic and musculoskeletal conditions (RMDs)**, taught by selected faculty of European experts in a very interactive virtual environment.

This course will promote high collaborative and interactive learning methodology by:

- forming groups of 10 (max.) participants before the start of the course (based on native language, namely Spanish, Portuguese, Others/English) who will interact in a chat forum during the weekdays, to discuss two clinical scenarios (one each week); these groups will be facilitated by an expert who speaks the defined group language.
- summing-up the weekly discussion at the main Friday Live sessions, discussing the cases with leading experts who will talk about the key issues of the clinical scenarios, and by participating in workshops. All these will use an interactive format with live Q&A.
- providing knowledge through keynote and live Q&A sessions by experts

Learning objectives

- Be familiar with interventions commonly executed by health professionals in rheumatology (HPR) in the assessment and management of people with rheumatic and musculoskeletal disease (RMDs).
- Have in-depth knowledge on psychosocial aspects of RMDs and behavioural change techniques.

Structure of the course

The course includes pre-readings, introductory session, clinical case discussions in small groups, two speaker keynote sessions and two workshops.

For the forum case discussions and workshops, course participants will be asked in advance to split into small groups of maximum 10 participants each. These groups will be in three languages: English, Spanish, and Portuguese. All learning activities will be structured and guided by 6 EULAR experts.

Limited spaces per group; Sign up on a first come, first serve basis.

Pre-readings (advisable)

Prior to the course, participants will have the chance to access, for a limited time, certain parts of three modules of the EULAR Online Course for Health Professionals in Rheumatology, namely (I) Psychosocial Approaches; (II) Osteoarthritis and (III) Assessment and Evaluation. These pre-readings will ensure your active participation in the group discussions and workshops.

Introductory session

The course will start with a 1-hour introductory live session, where course participants will be briefed on the methodology of the course, pre-readings and what to expect at different workshops within the assigned groups. The attendance for this session is strongly advised.

Clinical cases

The course will navigate around two case-studies that will be discussed throughout the weekdays (Monday to Friday) by chat on a dedicated forum on the course platform (linked to e-mail).

Each group will discuss the cases in their language with the facilitator. There will be no established times to engage and participate. The student will have access to the cases from the beginning of the course.

Workshops

In two of the three live sessions there will be workshops in the same small groups with interactivity.

Keynote sessions

There will be a keynote session lead by an expert with a live Q&A during two of the live sessions.
