COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a 1.5-day course for health professionals in rheumatology (HPR) on the management of common rheumatic and musculoskeletal conditions (RMDs), taught by selected faculty of European experts in a very interactive and cordial environment. The course will focus on the knowledge and skills most relevant to HPRs' daily practice. Participants will have the opportunity to meet experts in an informal setting and network with other HPRs with different professional backgrounds and career pathways.

Learning objectives

- Gain up-to-date knowledge on the management of pain, fatigue, physical activity, and telecare interventions in rheumatology, particularly for conditions like RA, OA, and others.
- Acquire practical skills in assessing and managing fracture risk, cardiovascular health, and physical function in patients with RMDs.
- Understand and apply interdisciplinary approaches, including rehabilitation and firstline mental health support for patients and colleagues.
- Enhance competence in both pharmacological and non-pharmacological interventions for pain management and wound care.
- Develop familiarity with the development of innovative care models using the Medical Research Council's framework for Complex Interventions, such as the development of a new nurse-led interdisciplinary self-management intervention (INSELMA).
- Engage in clinical case discussions to apply learned principles to complex, realworld scenarios, reinforcing collaborative, patient-centered care approaches.

Course certification

After the course, all participants who have successfully completed the course will receive a certificate of attendance on their EULAR School user account. 100% course attendance is required.
