OBJECTIVES

Nailfold capillaroscopy is a unique method that differs with noninvasiveness, easy and rapid performance and is the only technique for morphological evaluation of the nailfold capillaries. Its major role in rheumatology is to facilitate the differential diagnosis of Raynaud's phenomenon. In systemic sclerosis capillaroscopic findings are diagnostic. Microangiopathy is also observed in a number of other rheumatic disease with peripheral vascular syndromes. Recently, EULAR Study Group on Microcirculation in Rheumatic Diseases has accepted a fast-track algorithm for differentiation of scleroderma from non-scleroderma pattern and consensus on minimum reporting standards in capillaroscopy. The evolving knowledge about microcirculation in rheumatic diseases requires continuing education of the specialists involved in capillaroscopy diagnostics.

The aim of the course is to educate proper technique of capillaroscopy, analysis of capillaroscopic images, interpretation of the results, differentiation between normal and pathological findings in rheumatic diseases. The course provides also a summary of the most recent advances in the field of microvascular pathology in rheumatic diseases from leading experts in the field.
